On May 25, 1787, George Washington became America’s first famous government meeting planner in the Pennsylvania State House, where he was unanimously elected to preside over the Philadelphia Convention. The meeting was adjourned on Sep 17 after the final draft of the United States Constitution was signed by 39 of the 55 delegates.
